Dear Mr Brown,

The recent increased demand for the League's monthly news letter "Civil Rights" has encouraged the committee to consider increasing the circulation on a nation-wide scale, and producing it in printed, instead of duplicated, form.

We seek your assistance in increasing the distribution, and write to ask whether your Divisions would be prepared to place a bulk order for the news letter for distribution to their members, possibly as an enclosure with your own literature. A number of copies are being sent to them, and to you, to assist the members of your executive in considering our request.

The practicability of printing the news letter depends on the success of this appeal, and the cost depends upon the circulation. It is hoped that the cost will not exceed 2/- a dozen copies. It will be kept as low as possible.

We are prepared to overprint the news letter with the words "Supplement to ..." if desired.

We feel that you will appreciate the importance of constantly reminding the public of the fundamental issues of civil rights, and the desirability of enlarging what has been one of the most effective activities of the Civil Rights League, and trust that you will co-operate with us to this end.

Please let us know how many copies you would like each month. As we have to notify the printers of our requirements for the November issue, we shall appreciate hearing from you, if possible, by October 25th.
