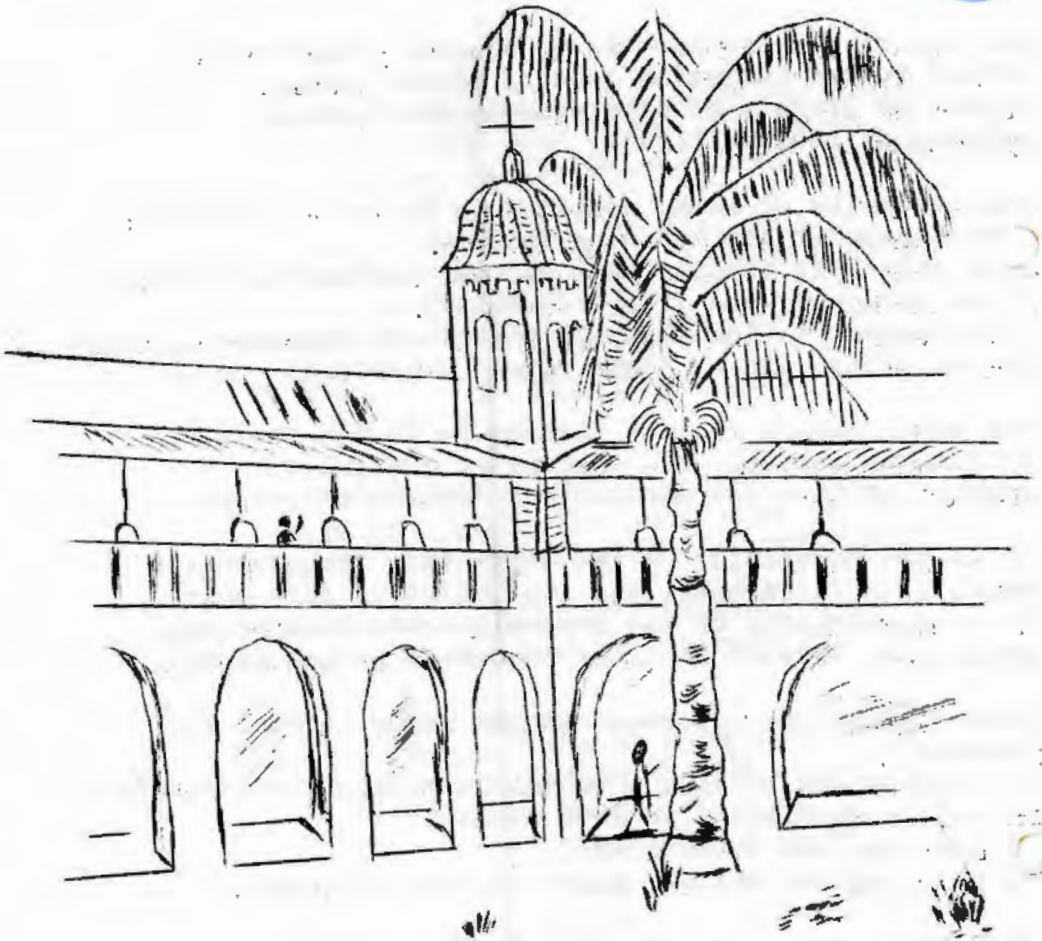

- 1 The aim of the Seminary is to educate young men to become future Christian leaders of our people, either as priests or otherwise in the various spheres of social life.

The condition of being admitted is therefore twofold :
Good character and learning ability.

Good character implies that our pupils take the Catholic faith seriously and live accordingly.

- Consequently we admit pupils who are recommended by their parish priest and by their school principal.

- 2 The pupil should realize that he is in the Seminary by his own choice. The keeping of the rules is a sign of cooperation and respect towards the staff.

It is the conviction of the staff that the education which is offered here, and the religious life which is characteristic of the Seminary, will benefit any young man, whether he later becomes a priest or not.

- 3 Three things are important in the daily life at the Seminary :
 - a) praying and leading a religious life, which expresses itself in good itself in good conduct;
 - b) learning and working well;
 - c) enjoying recreation, music, sports and games.

- 4 Some rules are to be observed by every pupil :
 - a) to study and live in accordance with the spirit and the tradition of the Seminary;
 - b) no pupil is allowed to leave the premises without permission;
 - c) drinking and smoking are not allowed.

- 5 The Seminary prepares for the Junior Certificate Examination, and the Senior Certificate Examination (Matriculation course)

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6 Requirements :

The pupils should have the necessary clothing for Sundays and weekdays (including underwear, pyamas; further : bedsheets, blankets, towels, handkerchiefs, comb, toothbrush)

Every pupil should have a Zulu Hymn and Prayerbook.
It is strongly recommended that in order to take full part in sports he should have football boots.
These can be bought at the Seminary, as well as shorts and jersey for sports.

7 Fees :

BOARDING FEES : R 120,- per year. (R 30,- must be paid in full by the first week of February, June, August and October respectively)

N.B.

Not included in the above are examination fees, doctor and hospital charges. Damage done to Seminary property must be paid for.

Certain books, like Dictionaries, Atlases, the New Testament, The New Catechism, etc. can be borrowed from the Seminary Library.

8. GENERAL INFORMATION :

- a) All pupils must be present on the day before school opens. Late-comers may be refused admission, unless they produce a letter of explanation written by the parents.
- b) The June and December reports are sent to parents and to the parish priest.
- c) The Seminary authorities preserve the right to open the correspondence of the pupils.
- d) The pupils are advised to hand their pocket money to Fr. Prefect.
- e) Permission to leave the Seminary for a visit home or to relatives will only be given if the parents have written a letter of request to the Rector.
- f) When a pupil receives visitors he should introduce them to Fr. Rector or Fr. Prefect.
