Now I can type again, I have at last made the time to send off the second quarter's money for the August boys to their school in Tsolo - and among the file on them I have found your letter to David Russell. I had left it in your large envelope, meaning to hand it to him. And of course I forgot to do so. Please forgive me. I shall get a very withering look from David when I do hand your letter to him soon.

My wrist is not quite recovered, but I'm able to type reasonably well again. You'll have seen from the papers that we are all embroiled in Publications Act charges. It is a privilege to be charged in the company of (now) 4 priests, Rev. Moses Moletsane having been joined in with us to-day. We are all on remand to 9th May, when a date for trial will be set. Three Anglicans and an agnostic!(me) and a Roman Catholic.

There was quite a scene when ~~XXXXXX~~ four of us went to have our fingerprints taken. Have you had this done to you? It is a very slow and thorough business, and I was most intrigued. The Bishop said to the Investigating Officer "We are so happy about this. We have prayed for it to happen." The case, he meant.

Thank you again for the R100 for Sylvia's boys, she is really tremendously grateful. The horrible part is that they have had poor teaching in the first quarter, and certain text books had not yet arrived. So the boys tried to transfer to Blytheswood, but it was impossibly full up. So there is nothing for it but to pay the money and hope things will look up... they are clever boys, but I think the system is going to let them down again. I really don't know what to do for the best.
