Dear Peter,

Thank you for your letter dated 25th Nov. but which I only received on 7th Dec.

I phoned George Rodger who said he had meant to write you, and according to what I understood on the 'phone, the response in June was R620 plus a sum of R200 from you and a further R10 recently from X? A total of R830.

I phoned Agnes Mododile this morning and asked her to check with the Bank that all this has in fact come through to her Savings a/c. At present there is a sum of about R400 written in the book, she says. That includes some I gave her, some from David Russell and from Adrienne Whisson, possibly others. I also suggested to her that she close that account and open another in her own name. She has legal right to operate on Cromwell's a/c and as there is no hope of his recovering, I think she should save herself a lot of inconvenience by moving the money across now before he dies. She thanked me for the advice and intends to do this on Monday, the first chance she'll get.

I hope George will write and give you detail of names and amounts if this is what you require - I imagine it is - to assess who can be asked for what further help. Otherwise, a generally worded appeal with a sentence that says you don't have to respond if you have already done as much as possible in this case?

Agnes says Cromwell is very ill, cannot speak though he tries, and refuses food and drink. I don't know what is keeping him alive.
