Dear Sandra,

Thank you for your letter which reached me a few days ago.

First of all, can you not change the dates you have given yourself for your project and make the title "The Liberal Party", or something like that? Why I suggest this is because the Liberal Party was only launched in 1953 and it would be easier to get material covering its whole life than just the five years to 1958.

I have found some things which may help you and will post them off in the next few days. They are a Liberal Party badge, its Handbook, a booklet on its policies, a booklet on "blackspot" removals, and several copies of a journal called Liberal Opinion which the Party published. I am afraid my 'history', that Alan Paton told you about, is in manuscript form and has not been published, so I can't send you that. Most of what I have found is post-1958 I'm afraid.

If you went to the S.A. Library and asked them if you could see back-numbers of a journal called CONTACT, I am sure you would find a lot of interesting material in there. Although it was not directly connected with the Liberal Party it was edited by Patrick Duncan, who was a member, and it carried a good deal of news about the Party.

I will go on looking for material for you, even after I have sent off this first lot, but perhaps you could let me know whether what I have sent is at all suitable first / Also when your deadline is for the project?
