We know that our requests are reasonable and moderate. We do not minimise the complexities of our country's problems, but we are entirely convinced that by far the best way to a solution is the way of discussion and negotiation. Your present approach is an impossible one, and the country is nearing the disastrous end of a blind alley.

If you accept our requests you will ^{go} down in History as a man who had the sense to accept reality, as a man ~~was~~ of pivotal importance in the constructive solution of South Africa's problems.

This is our final appeal, Dr Verwoerd.

We will wait until the 7 o'clock ~~news~~ SABC news on for your reply. If you indicate that that you are ready to meet our requirements we will be overjoyed.

But if there is no announcement that you are willing to co-operate you will be forcing us to accept that you can only be moved by the killing of White South Africans.

We have plans for such killing, and with great reluctance we will put these plans into operation if you reject or ignore our initiative.

We are determined men, Dr Verwoerd. We have stated the position very clearly so that there can be no misunderstanding.

The decision is now yours.
