Dear Prof,

Many thanks for your letter of 21th, and for the documents which you sent me later by separate post. I have made copies of these and enclose them original, which I imagine you would like back as soon as possible.

I found your letter most interesting, and helpful. It was a good idea to send a copy to Hurler, as I shall be discussing the whole question with him and Hilly, as well as with Hurdell, over here. I may want to purchase a number of the prints which you raise with you in a later letter, as soon as my ideas for the album have crystallized. I hope you don't mind my not doing so now.

I am still concerned to persuade you to let me see the record in full. The prospect of receiving it is very attractive to me (being involved in the U.S.A. case involved reading about it, 100 pages). I can, however, see that there are technical problems about getting it here. Would it not be possible for you to let me have one volume of it? I should only need to keep it for a day or two, to copy it and will then send it back to you promptly. I know that this is a bit cumbersome but I think that if we use registered post and insure the parcel there should be no difficulty over preserving it.

Do please give the matter some further consideration.
