Dear John, *hang.*

I enclose a letter to the Ganef, which sets out the situation regarding his request. I have asked Liz - as the most reliable person in Joburg at the moment who can be trusted - to handle the matter for me, and the object left with Phyllis Lewsen today by air. Liz will consult Arnie if necessary, and use people like Ruth Heyman to find out about people leaving for Europe.

I am disappointed not to have heard from you in reply to my letters concerning the TU conference, the money I am supposed to be administering on behalf of the other body, and Thomas. Have you received my letters?

My father asked me whether I had been receiving all of yours. I think I have, but you might like to write to me every so often at my home (Idoville, Durban Rd., Wynberg, Cape) simply notifying me of letters sent. No names, no signatures. Just addressed to the Householder,

Opinion in the party appears to have swung away from its socialist inclination of July-September: there is renewed interest in the Liberal International - notwithstanding the fact that no-one except Alan and perhaps Peter are aware of what happened at the Hague meeting - and I have in fact received a mandate to write to the various liberal parties in the world to ask for help of various kinds.
