My dear Alan,

I do hope my letter about Dorrie reached you; not that I want a reply but I did in fact recommend one or two books which I thought you might find helpful. I do hope things are not too lonely and that you are managing to get ahead with the Geoffrey Clayton book. Certainly I would love to help with that in any way I can.

I have just heard from Diana Collins that John is being put up for the Nobel Peace Prize and I feel that we ought to rally round in support. Apparently it is quite normal for some lobbying to be done and if you felt able to send a line to the Chairman, the Nobel Peace Prize Committee, Parliament House, Oslo, I believe your name would carry great weight (almost as much as mine!).

I gather C.R. is very excited at the prospect of the new work in Stellenbosch and I think it sounds a very well worthwhile proposition. Nevertheless I know I would find it extremely difficult, if not impossible, to do any very effective work in South Africa to-day. How I wish I could talk to you about the enormously complicated problems for us of the attitude of Malawi to South Africa.

Please write whenever you have time and let me know how things are going.
