Dear Bishop,

Thank you for your letter of January 7th. I have written to the Archbishop and told him that Dorrie's health is such that I could not leave her. Archbishop Edward, although he suffers a great deal, does not like to speak about it. He is extremely stiff and gets out of and into the car with the utmost difficulty. He is a wonderful man.
