Dear Jojo,

Thank you for your letter (Anne is replying separately to Margaret). We shall look forward to seeing you on December 20th., and I am enclosing your Christmas cheque for R35.00, for you and Margaret and the children.

I am writing to ask for your help in a job that I do not think will take a long time. Julie Wells was of great assistance to me, but she omitted some important items. In the "Watchman" of October 1939 there was a reprint of Clayton's sermon "War and the Christian". In the "Watchman" of June 1942 Clayton appeared to describe the Governor General's Fund as a "form of gambling" and in the "Watchman" of May 1944 Clayton strongly criticised a speech in London by the High Commissioner and its "idyllic" picture of the conditions under which Africans live. I do not by any means want the full contents of these three items, but I would like to know:

1. What main points Clayton made in his sermon
2. Why did he call the Fund a form of gambling
3. Enough material to indicate what Clayton said and what the High Commissioner said also.
