I received a cable from Krueger today reading as follows:-
"Principally agree with translation Hackel stop if necessary beg authorisation for revision because congenial translation for this book particularly necessary". It seems to me that it would be a good thing if you communicated with Krueger at once. Any doubts you may have should surely be set at rest by this cable. However, I adhere to what I wrote before, that I am still prepared to give you a further period to make other arrangements, but I feel I must support the advice of your German friends and ask you to let Krueger have at least part of your translation as soon as possible.
