Dear Mrs. Paton:

Mr. Paton says you will not mind if I bother you about a couple of translation rights, so I hope it will not be too much trouble for you.

First of all, I should like to know whether the contract covering the German translation rights provides that the sale of the book is limited to any particular territory. In other words, we have an inquiry for the German language rights in Switzerland and I wonder whether your contract covers Germany and possibly leaves Switzerland still free?

Then I want to make sure that the Spanish language rights are still free. Both Mr. Paton and I think they are but I want to make absolutely sure before trying again to sell the book in Argentina.

Your husband seems very busy and cheerful rushing around and I am only sorry you are not here also to see a bit more of New York.
