Many thanks for your letter of October 14. I am glad that you enjoyed the book. Yours is the first letter that I have had from an African reader.

Now let me explain to you about the translation. The usual way it is done is this. The person who wishes to translate the book goes to a publisher and says, I wish to translate this book. The publisher goes to the author who says I shall sell my rights at so much per printed copy. If the publisher accepts, he and the translator must then make their own agreement. You should therefore approach one of your own publishers. I can assure you that I am ready to make a contract which will keep the costs of the book as low as possible for the African reader.
