Dear Mrs. January,

We regret the long delay involved in sending you final accounts for Sponono, but you probably heard about the unfortunate court case in which Mr. Leshoai has been involved. Fortunately, he was discharged on all counts last week.

You will see from the accounts that we have to call on you to pay us R663-95 in terms of the guarantee your organisation provided for Sponono. We are claiming a refund on entertainment tax paid. If this comes through, we will repay half of it to you. The total amount of entertainment tax is R158-94.

We are sorry that our first joint venture, ⁱⁿ Kimberley went so badly. We have a number of other projects in which there will be less expense and which ~~will~~ help you to make up for this loss.

Unfortunately, we ourselves are in serious financial difficulties because of everything that has happened so we must ask you to let us have your cheque as soon as possible. Until we receive your payment we are unable to settle urgent matters like the royalties owed to Mr. Paton.

We look forward to your early reply.
