Dear Phillis,

I was sentence to 4 years imprisonment ,for member ship of a banned organization (P. A. C.). I was arrested on the 2. 5. 63 & convicted and sentenced on the 18. 7. 63. and part of my imprisonment I served at Robbin Island..

I was defended by Mr. R. A. F. Swartwho had brief ed Advocat A. Wilson.

Because of refusing to be sent to Nongoma ,I was served with a ban two weeks after the 17. 7. 67. During the ban period I offered employment by T. W. Gcabashe & co,They could n not keep me more then 3 months because of the presure of the S. Bs..Towards the end of last year I was employed by the Bear gro up in less then a month they had to sack me ,here also the S. B! put presure on them.I have been assisted by P. S. M. Ngakane as from km time to time.

I have a family ,my aged father and 4 children 2 of them are in Form 1lthis year last year the Schools closed when I was left with the balance of R7. Already the Principal has orde the children to come to me and fetch the monney.I have a boy in Std 1V last born is in Std 1ll.

On the 12.12.70 Iwas examined by Dr. D. N. Randeria: Imust get spectacles at R22 .Failing to pay School fee for the C children means I cannot protect my sight.

I wonder if it could be humanly ~~possib~~ possible for you to assist us.

This request must not be interpreted to mean that your position is overlooked.
