before the Commission, directed his complaint not against Indians resident in this area but to the type of buildings which he alleged, Indians built and in which they lived. His complaint as stated by him is against the Borough of Port Shepstone, which he thought allowed the erection of these buildings. His main, and perhaps only complaint, was in regard to congestion of area from where his centre residence was to the boundary of the Borough - a distance of 2 a mile away.

Albertsville is mainly a farming district and abuts on to the Borough of Port Shepstone and therefore outside its control.

Near the residence of Mr. Bannister, Mr. P. Pillay owns land in extent 30 acres with a well built cottage in which he and his family reside.

It was established that a majority of people who live in this area are Indians.

There is no case for our Association to answer in regard to this area.
