Only three weeks are left & until your departure to Europe. We wish you very much that you don't have to suffer too much until then, and that your time in Europe will bring you relief.

As I mentioned yesterday, I have to tell you, unfortunately, that the dental treatment in Germany is very expensive, and as you would have to pay as a private patient, you would have to pay all and everything, probably a few thousand Pounds!! But as you said that things have been arranged in U.K., we know you in good hands. If necessary, Piers offered to help ~~anyway~~, e.g. finding a good dentist. I would have liked to send you some pictures with this letter but, unfortunately, they have not been processed yet. All the pictures I took in Lesotho are slides, and when I got them, ~~it was~~ it was of a great disappointment, because many of them didn't turn out well, due to a fault in the objective. ~~the~~ Only those taken with the teleobjective are quite alright, and, fortunately enough, among them are some of you, Sids and Dorothy. So, you get some copies as soon as possible.

more so, as we could relax in Lenkha. Here, we find
ourselves too busy again, visiting people here and there,

Therefore, we don't have much of holidays here. Yet,
we enjoy to meet so many friends and our families.
We also intend to spend one ~~to~~ week in Boln to
visit Dse, ~~and~~ Dorothee's cousin Daa and my
youngest sister Heta (also a member of the AAT) who
got a little daughter, three only 10 days
ago!! Dse will be disappointed not to see you this
month, but I hope that there will be a chance
in September.

Dorothee is awake again (Najjel is still resting, moving
a bit from the nights with Dorothee!!), and we are
expecting visitors, therefore I have to close. Also Tel. No.
Keep well. Please give us your address in U.K.
(I'm afraid I misplaced the address somewhere).
Give our love to all the people, Willie, Betty,
Nuala, the Remonks, Francis, Howard... (also
Julie, although we could not get so close to
him, as you know!), and above all others to Gals
of course; special regards from Dorothee to Jascha!
Tell him, not to be afraid anymore, next time,
Dorothee won't pull his leg any more!
