I know you wanted to remain in Africa and if that is still what you wish, I hope you will. However if you come here, please remember you have a place to live. We will be anxious to know what you decide.

We read about other refugees being expelled and wonder who will be there (in Lesotho) to aid new refugees.

I couldn't help being reminded of the way of Southern Africa when the girl who graduated tops in Michael's 6th grade class is the daughter of a South African woman (black) who came here on a scholarship and married. The girl is not only very smart (science is her favorite) but very beautiful and such a loss to her country.

We have a 14 yr. old Italian staying with us this month. He came on a summer exchange and speaks no English. We are enjoying him.

I guess if Leabua has put the U.A. and South African refugees on the same team we should wish them every success.

The kids are fine. Amy + Tim are in Ohio with Grandma and Michael is entertaining the Italian. It is very hot here. I imagine you'll miss the sun in England.
