Current Political Activity

Political History and Experience

Joined SACP in 1936 and has been active in liberation movement ever since. Secretary of the Cape District and member of the Central Committee from 1945 to date of arrest in 1966.

Elected as Communist candidate to Cape Provincial Council in 1949, Later expelled from that body under the Suppression of Communism Act.

After Party banned, worked first as editor then as Business Manager for the Guardian newspaper (and its successors).

Tried for Sedition in 1946 and Treason Trialist in 1956.

Subjected to comprehensive and repeated banning orders.

Tried under S of C Act in 1966 and served sentence of 5 years and 9 months in Pollsmoor and Pretoria.

Joined family in exile on release in 1972. Active in London branches of ANC and SACP. Served on SACP International Committee, on NEC of AAM and as Chairman of AAM Trade Union Committee.

Worked as Senior Admin Officer in Membership and Organisation Department of the National Union of Teachers.

Returned to Cape Town in 1991.
