Your letter Ref. No. 35/527 of the 12th instant refers.

Our Congress is prepared to meet the sub-committee of your Council at a Round Table Conference in terms of our letter of the 28th December, 1946.

Accordingly, we have appointed Dr. C. M. Naicker and Messrs. A. I. Meer and M. D. Naidoo as representatives of this Congress.

The heading under which your letter of the 12th instant is written appears to convey the impression that your sub-committee is to be of a permanent nature. We wish it to be clearly understood that our willingness to meet your sub-committee at a Round Table Conference does not indicate our support for or co-operation in any permanent sub-committee re: Indian Problems that your Council may be considering.

Kindly advise us at your earliest of the specific matters you wish to discuss at this Conference. Immediately on receipt of such advice, we shall acquaint you of any matters we wish to raise.
