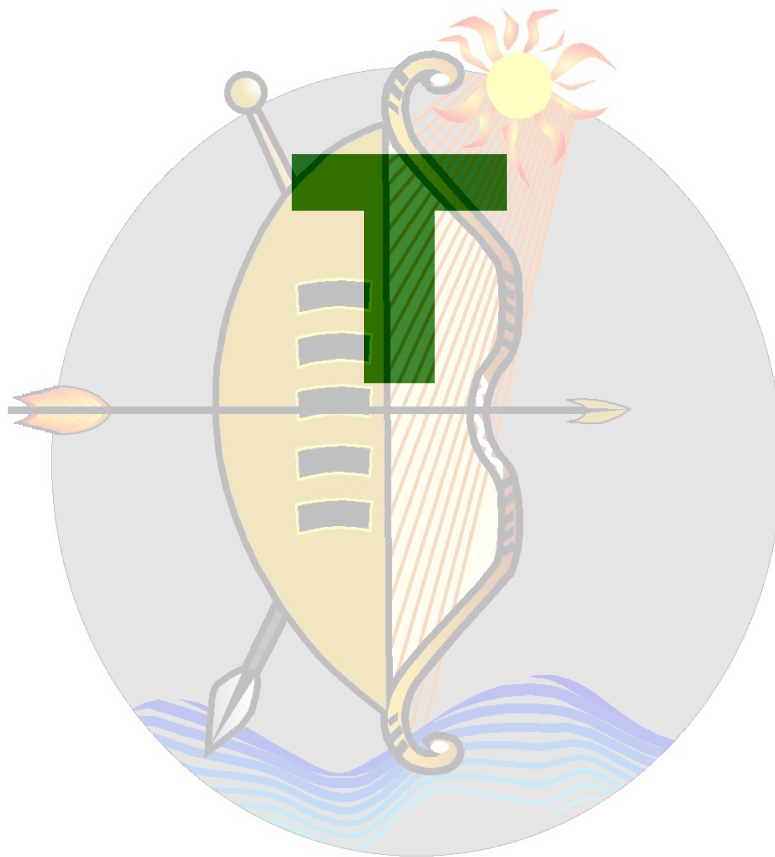

# SUMMARY TRIAL FOR TSAFENDIS

CAPE TOWN, Saturday.  
**T**HE Attorney-General of the Cape, Mr. W. E. van den Berg, S.C., said yesterday that Demitrio Tsafendis, the 48-year-old alleged assassin of Dr. Verwoerd, would appear at a summary trial at the Supreme Court in Cape Town.

No date has yet been fixed for the trial, but Mr. van den Berg will lead the evidence for the State.

Although there was no official information, it is believed that Mr. Justice Beyers, the Judge-President, will be on the Bench with two assessors.

## SECURITY

Strict security precautions will be taken at the trial to prevent any possible demonstrations or attempts to harm Tsafendis when he appears in court.

Special arrangements are being made with regard to the admission of Press representatives and members of the public to the trial.

Many journalists representing foreign newspapers, radio and television networks are expected to attend the trial together with representatives of all major South African newspapers.

The indictment will be drawn up by Mr. van den Berg as soon as the complete statements regarding Tsafendis are sent to him by the police.

Senior Cabinet Ministers, Members of Parliament and police are expected to give evidence at the trial, which will last several days.

The Daily News London correspondent reports that Tsafendis, is not allowed into any British territory
