I am now home again for a little while, then I go to Oxford & after that to Durham for Christmas.

The Peacock (or Peahen) is still here but I'm not happy about it for the winter. I told my neighbour I would not be responsible for it if they wanted to keep it, it was up to them to find shelter for the coldest weather.

I am so pleased to hear that Sukis is enjoying St Christopher's. I was happy there but that was a long time ago.

What a sad homecoming you had with so many of your friends having left this earth & no daughters around. I'm glad the banning order proved unproductive to the perpetrators.

I hope you will find that after your medical treatment here your headaches will ease up with time. You are not really old yet.

I'm sorry that you found London "my native town" so dirty. We were proud of it before the war but now our advance has in some ways been a deterioration in others. No one takes pride in their neighbourhood & government spending is on Nuclear & other armaments instead of street sweepers who now draw the dole & leave the litter on the streets.

The H.P.s sweep by in their cars & do not see all that is obvious to the inhabitants & walkers. If there is a royal or Lord Mayors procession these streets are cleared for the day.

Hazel, my youngest granddaughter, goes to nursery school now each morning & loves it. She is just 3 years & is quite bright & quick. It helps having older children around in the home to copy.

Robin aged 4 now goes to prep school with his big sister Rebecca aged nearly 11. After next summer she will go with her brother to the grammar school in Durham. So they are all growing up. It is such a pity their mother couldn't live to see them now.

It was great to meet you in the summer. I also had a visitor from Johannesburg. A white social worker, from England but has been there many years. She is a quaker like will do anything a lot of her & the work she is doing.

I sent your money to N. Ireland but forgot to put in your address so they were unable to send a receipt. Thank you for that.
