re: Indian Penetration.

I beg to confirm my final telegram to you in this matter which I despatched to you this morning, reading as follows :-

"Re interview regarding Indian Penetration STOP After discussions with members of Provincial Executive I now confirm that seventh December will be suitable for interview with Minister STOP Arrangements have been made on that basis".

As a result of conversations which the Chairman of my General Purposes Committee (Councillor A.L. Barns) has had with members of the Provincial Executive, the difficulties which were previously in the way of meeting the Minister on 7th December 1942, have been removed. Arrangements have now been made for the deputation to travel to Pretoria and to be in attendance at the Minister's office on that day.
