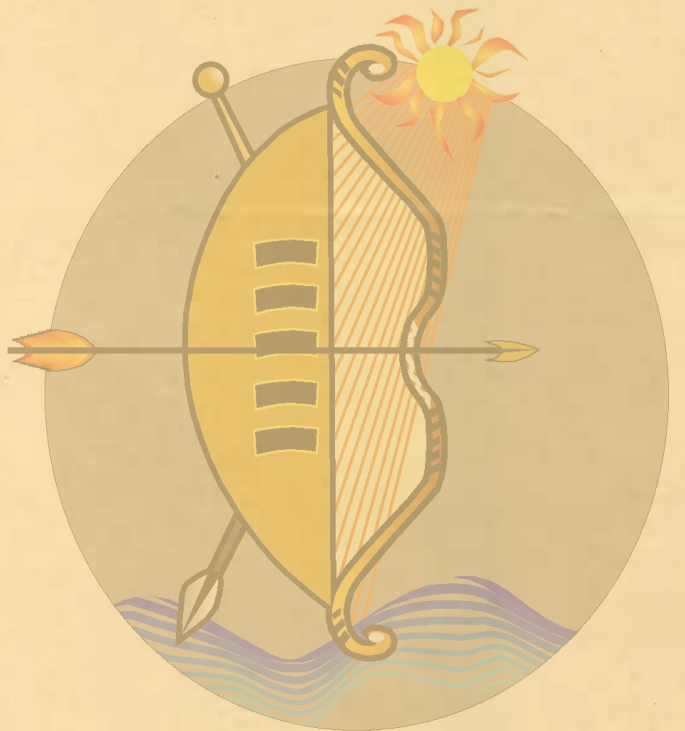

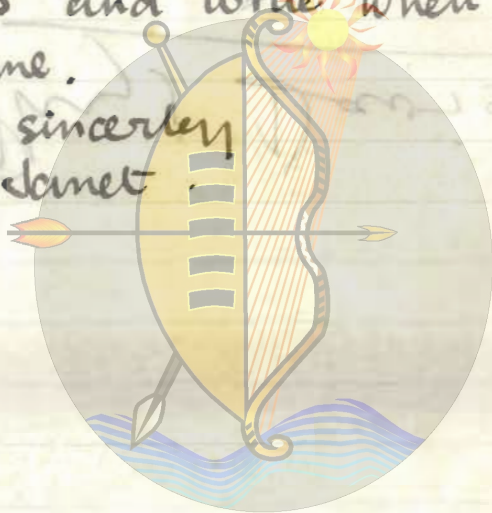
I do hope everything is alright with you and your husband is not too fed up with everything. It must be very difficult for you and I suppose we can only hope that things will get better.
