Darling,

All being well I should see you on Saturday the 27th March, and if the authorities give this to you before I do, so much the better.

Your letter dated the 7/2/71 reached me on the 8/3/71. In fact would be a useless expression. But I am taking this up with the authorities.

You had not had my letters dated 14/2/71 my 1st Feb. letter. I do hope that you have had my 2nd Feb. letter dated 7/3/71, letter in lieu of Feb visit same date, my 1st March letter 7/3/71 and a copy of the letter I addressed to the Minister of Justice. I have since then heard from the Minister of Justice "The Minister will bear your representations in mind if and when your case is considered by him.

I have two more Mondays to report. IF I am not rebanned I shall take the 1st off from work and take my children to the Harbour and show them around and enjoy the beauty there which we enjoyed five years ago. Isn't it funny that my restrictions hurt me most in that respect. I keep talking of the past tense. I know what you keep saying. I am saying it too.

We are very hopeful for an amnesty in May. Perhaps we wont have to wait till next year to see you nay all of you. Mewa is very busy and we keep hoping.

Though there is very little change about here at home, but there are so many signs of very meaning ful happenings. Either way there is very little hope of a continuance of this existence. TIME

MD do you remember who taught me this game of chess. Did I tell you? I cannot imagine that I have not. His wee brother is v very ill. The chances of his immediate release from this awful pain is in the hands of skilled surgeons of course. But I keep thinking I may be able to help. But I shall only do so after much and care ful consideration. But if you veto it. So shall it be. In these matters I must bow to your superior intellect.

Your letter arrived on the day I wrote Afrikaans. I failed of course. But that will be the last time I do. Once this restriction business is resolved I shall settle down to work. An hour a day.

One of our local papers had a photo of you and others as Passive resisters. Sukhthi says that is not my Dad. A move to breathe life into a dead organ. Think about whether you would like me to get that photo.

S.V.Reddy has passed on. His release from pain is here. What an awful period he has been through. He too is in that picture and what a fine man he was then. He never forgot Billy thro out his days. I am most anxious about my brother Bill. Why he does not try to improve himself study wise is beyond me. I do want so much to know if you can will you tell me. I must see him and convince him he is on the wrong path. IF Need be I shall approach his boss. I am waiting to hear from my son too. Well I am going to do my damnest to see that they dont hurt my child. If they do God help them and me.

It is Sunday, no servant, fatigued, Children asleep, seeing you next week I shall say Tot Siens. Your letter About my most is very disturbing. Have you heard that she is perhaps in Hospital. Have not seen Sahdhan, Sha fair, Sukhthi tops.
