THE 27th annual Andhra eisteddfod festival will be held by the Andhra Maha Sabha of South Africa at Andhra House, Leopold Street, Durban, on Sunday, August 14.

Pupils from five Andhra, or Telegu, language schools from various parts of Natal will take part in a day-long programme which includes Gobbi, or Andhra folk dancing.

"South Africa has a great deal to offer all races. I believe that with love and tolerance an understanding of different points of view will resolve political problems," he said. Time was the only sure test of faith and would reveal the true worth of our regard for human values.

"In multi-racial South Africa the divergence of ethnic groupings is patently apparent. However, there are clearly defined divisions of thought and philosophy in Europeans of differing origin."

The motion he introduced to the parliament was that a return to religious principles was the answer to peaceful co-existence in multi-racial South Africa. He said that the importance of religion could not be overstressed.
