

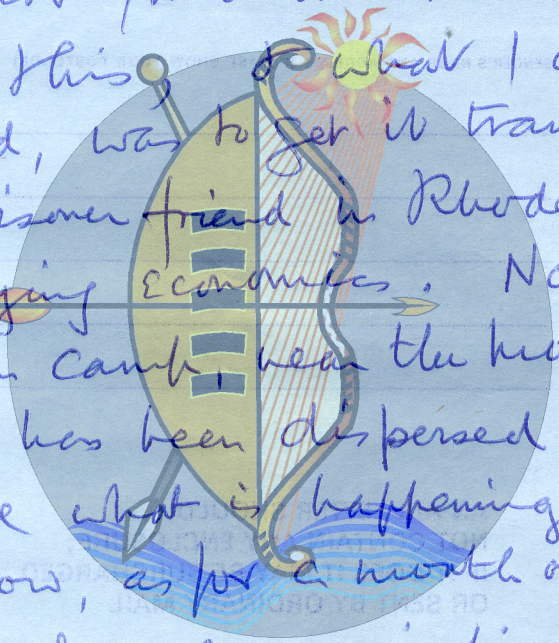

Thanks for your airmail letter of the 16th. Sorry you have such a difficult time with Subhithi & hope she is now quite recovered. As regards the Economist you did ask me to cancel this, & what I could do, and did, was to get it transferred to a prisoner friend in Rhodesia who is studying Economics. Now his detention camp near the Mozambique border, has been dispersed, so I am not sure what is happening to the paper now, as for a month or more I have had no communication, nor a new address. Hope your friend Doc keeps well, & that his ban will end on the due date. I am hoping things will go better for all concerned in Southern Africa before the year is out. We are all living through difficult times, but we shall no doubt overcome in due course. Do you still hear from my friends the Simmons's? We have now started a new Amnesty International group in Ipswich, mostly young people, which is very encouraging - they will be able to take over from the old ones, & keep the flag flying. Best wishes to all from us all. YMS
