Dearest Phyllis,

Remember us? Yes! you correctly remembered our surname — but what matter if you did not, we'd love you just the same. You had the address right, so your letter reached us safely, though it is so long since you wrote ~~to~~ that you may have wondered if we had had it. January, indeed, & now it is September. In the months between we have thought about <sup>you</sup> often. In 3 months & 3 days it will be exactly 10 years since you wrote your first letter to us, & in all that decade you have never asked us for anything until your last letter when you said you would like a copy of Helen's autobiography. To date, I have been unable to get a copy as it is now out of print, so I am writing to the 2nd-hand book shops but, so far, without success. If it is banned, would it reach you safely if I posted it? If you think it will I would consider it a privilege to send you my copy.

I am sorry I made you angry by asking stupid questions about your children. So sad that your cottage has so many disruptive consequences lasting so long. "New Living" is the second S.A. newspaper to be banned soon after you sent me a copy.

Thank you for sending me John Osmer's address; I wrote to him. The hope was that we could visit him as we get to Louisa about twice a year, but he was leaving at the end of March to "visit New Zealand" so we did not see him. As pity as it would have been such a joy to have met someone who has actually seen you & talked with you. He said,

after that, he was hoping to find other work "somewhere in Southern Africa." When you said he was at the Community of the Resurrection I assumed he was a Roman Catholic, but his reply came from Holy Cross Village so I wonder now if he is an Anglican.

Daily, our paper has news of events in Southern Africa. I read that Albertina's banning had not been renewed. I know that Nompomo Mandela's banning expires this year, but do not know if it has yet, but about a couple of months ago she was interviewed on television, so I am wondering if it has. All the TV reporters from S.A. are white & mostly, they peddle the official S.A. information, & I imagine it is the same with the papers.

And now about you & Sue. How are you both? Well I hope. Tell us about yourselves when you write. Notah & I had a wonderful holiday this year. Michael (our elder boy) works in London where he has become friendly with Gulshan Nayakali, an Asian born in Tanzania of Indian-kin parents, who now lives in London. She asked us if we (Notah & I) would like to go to India with her & stay with her friends & relations there. We did, & had a grand time.

I have books about apartheid, I have photographs that illustrate apartheid, but I want some colour slides that show it in operation. Neither the Methodist Church or the International Defence & Aid Fund have any slides. Do you know of any organisation here that might have some? As we do not write very often, we hope the accompanying calendar will remind you of us more often than our letters do. Take care of yourself.
