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### P.E. UNIONS DEMAND ADEQUATE INCREASE

Workers in Port Elizabeth are angry. At a recent meeting of the Industrial Council for the building industry the bosses asked the unions to accept an increase of only 5c - 6c an hour in the workers' wages. They said that this was to help them fight inflation.

The works' unions refused this and demanded an increase of at least 9c an hour. 9c and home more would mean that the workers would only just be able to buy the same amount that they did last year. What the bosses asked for would not even keep their wages up with the rise in price of food, bus-fares, clothes and many other things. So it is not surprising that the workers would not agree to the bosses' proposals.

The workers receive very low wages as it is. They cannot be expected to pay more than they do already for the bosses' inflation.

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
