3. The response by Jimmy Kquger that he will not accept the B.P.A. as the authentic body representing us. We see no peace and order if our demands are not met

4. The statement by the Prime Minister that the racist regime "will not panic". We do not anticipate panic but expect responsible ACTION from the leaders of this country.

5. The action of elements burning schools we believe that is no black man's action.

6. The brutality experience by students in police hands especially those who have been recently arrested and released.

7. The abuse of power by security officers to refuse relatives to see detainees and demand a just investigation in the suspicious conditions in which Mr Mapetlo Mohapi died and we are afraid the same may befall our people.
