

BACKGROUND:

Since the imposition of Bantu Education in 1954 by the racist regime of South Africa, the ANC developed its own education policy. The education policy is briefly stated in the "FREEDOM CHARTER" as follows:- "The doors of Learning and Culture shall be Opened".

The policy includes the preparation of ANC cadres through proper training and education for full and responsible participation in the administration and development of South Africa when independence comes.

The basic aim is to promote self-reliance by planning the ANC prototype educational institutions both for Post-Apartheid South Africa and at our institutions in Morogoro and Dakawa.

IMMEDIATE OBJECTIVES

1. To take a retrospective view of the past two years (1986-1988) with special reference to impediments, implementation (of Educational Projects) and remedies including educational manpower development, examinations, inspection and staffing of our educational institutions. The Seminar will consider in-depth the role of education in the light of current educational experiences world-wide in Pre-and Post-Liberation period.
3. To study progress reports from SOMAFCO Secondary School, SOMAFCO Primary School, SOMAFCO Nursery School, SOMAFCO Pre-School, SOMAFCO Adult Education Sector, Dakawa Vocational Training Centre, Dakawa Education Orientation Centre and Distance Education Programme.
4. Re-examine the curriculum of all educational divisions with a view to improve the delivery of educational services in our institutions.
5. Study the Inspection Report prepared by UNESCO.

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6. To prepare plans for post-apartheid South Africa - reforms, expansion, teacher-training, curriculum Development.
7. Discuss the present educational crisis in Apartheid South Africa with a view to drawing up future plans.
8. Plan for the implementation of Post-Secondary Education and Professional Training.
