19. The following section is hereby inserted in the Scientific Research Council Act, 1945, after section *sixteen*, with effect from the commencement of that Act:

Insertion of section 16*bis* in Act 33 of 1945.

“Application of Act to South-West Africa. *16bis*. This Act shall apply also in the territory of South-West Africa.”.

20. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the South-West Africa Constitution Act, 1925 (Act No. 42 of 1925), or any other law, the Legislative Assembly of South-West Africa may appropriate moneys from the Revenue Fund of South-West Africa for the purposes for which the moneys referred to in sub-section (3) of section *fourteen* of the Scientific Research Council Act, 1945, may be applied.

Appropriation by legislative Assembly of South-West Africa of moneys for activities under Act 24 of 1945 and Act 33 of 1945.

21. Sections *four* to *nine*, inclusive, *twelve* and *twenty* of the Standards Act, 1945, the Standards Amendment Act, 1946, paragraphs (a), (c) and (e) of section *two* and sections *four* to *seven*, inclusive, *nine* and *ten* of the Standards Amendment Act, 1951, and sections *three* and *nine* of the Standards Amendment Act, 1952, are hereby repealed.

Repeal of laws.

22. This Act shall apply also in the territory of South-West Africa.

Application to South-West Africa.

23. This Act shall be called the Standards (Transfer of Administration) Act, 1956, and shall come into operation upon a date to be fixed by the Governor-General by proclamation in the *Gazette*.

ACT

To prohibit the granting of interdicts or other dilatory orders of court having the effect of staying or suspending the removal or ejection of natives in certain cases, and to provide for other incidental matters.

(English text signed by the Governor-General.)
(Assented to 15th June, 1956.)

BE IT ENACTED BY the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate and the House of Assembly of the Union of South Africa, as follows:—

- 1.** In this Act, unless the context otherwise indicates—

- (i) "native" means a native as defined in the law under which the order in question has been made, or where not so defined or where the order has been made under the common law, any person who is a member of an aboriginal race or tribe of Africa; (ii)
- (ii) "order" means any order, warrant, direction, notice, instruction or authority issued or purporting to have been issued under any law, and includes any order of court. (i)
- 2.** Whenever any native is or has at any time prior to the commencement of this Act been required by any order—
- Definitions.
- (a) to vacate, to depart or withdraw from, to be ejected or removed from, not to return to, not to be in or not to enter, any place or area; or
- (b) to be removed from any place or area to any other place or area; or
- (c) to be arrested or detained for the purpose of his removal or ejection from any place or area,
- The execution of certain orders shall not be stayed or suspended.
- no interdict or other legal process shall issue for the stay or suspension of the execution of such order or the removal of the property of such native in pursuance of such order, and no appeal against, or review proceedings in respect of, such order or any conviction or finding upon which such order is based, shall have the effect of staying or suspending the execution of such order or such removal in pursuance thereof.
- 3.** The stay or suspension (whether by order of court or by operation of law) of the execution of any order to which this Act applies, before the date of application of this Act to such order, shall be of no force and effect or shall lapse, as the case may be, as from such date.
- Stay or suspension of the execution of certain orders to be of no force and effect or to lapse.
- 4.** Any court which declares invalid any order to which this Act applies, may, on the application of any native affected by such order, order the payment of compensation to him for the actual loss sustained by him as a result of compliance with or the execution of such order.
- Compensation.
- 5.** (1) This Act shall apply only in respect of such orders or classes of orders and with effect from such date as may from time to time be specified by the Governor-General by proclamation in the *Gazette*.
- Application of Act.
- (2) The Governor-General may at any time in like manner alter or withdraw any proclamation issued under sub-section (1).
- 6.** This Act shall be called the Natives (Prohibition of Interdicts) Act, 1956.
